**CONSENT JUDGMENT
DELIVERED ON THE 15TH JULY, 2021**

The Petitioner and the Respondent have unanimously resolved that this petition be settled upon the following mutually agreed terms:

- i. That the marriage/relationship that existed so called between the Respondent and the Petitioner as husband and wife is hereby nullified.
- ii. That the Petitioner and the Respondent will continue to enjoy joint custody of Zalia Adurami Johnson Omoregie, the only child of the union.

Provided: that the parties in exercise of the rights conveyed in paragraphs (i) and (ii) above:

- a. Shall nurture the child with love and fear of God.
- b. Shall have regards to the best interest of the child before taking any decision.
- c. That the rights conveyed apply until the child attains majority.

- d. Petitioner, Respondent and the child shall continue to stay in the present house of the Petitioner and Respondent.
- e. The Petitioner and the Respondent shall continue to take care of the educational and health needs of the child. This includes payment of school fees, lessons, uniforms, stationeries, medical bills and other things associated thereto.
- f. That these terms of settlement shall be made the Judgment of this Honourable Court in the petition.

The terms of settlement between the parties which was adopted in court dated the 14th day of July 2021, but filed on the 15th July, 2021 is hereby adopted in court as prayed.

2. That the said terms of settlement shall remained binding on either parties and none of the party or parties shall opted out of same without the notifying the court with cogent reason forthwith.

Finally, the terms of settlement is hereby entered in court as the consent Judgment of the court today the 15th day of July, 2021. As it was witnessed by their respective learned Counsels accordingly. I so hold.
